Indeed, a Western Reserve Society member, recently returned from Louisville, reported that the famed



Minuteman statue outside of National SAR Head quarters is covered-up by a large tarp. We do not know why the statue was covered. But, for those who haven't been to NSSAR Headquarters in Louisville, the Minuteman statue was donated to NSSAR in 2009 by the Philadelphia chapter at a cost of around \$50,000. The Bronze statue was unveiled in 2015. The Minuteman itself is over 800 lbs and stands 8 feet tall. He stands upon a base weighing over 19,000 pounds.

Locally, our Society is sponsoring several inperson member events in the second half of this year. The "fellowship" dinner at the venerable Union Club on September 14th is intended to be just

that - a minimum of speechmaking (ok, perhaps a couple of announcements), and a maximum of feeling the freedom of association again with fellow members and guests and doing so over a pleasant dinner. I look forward to it very much.

The "big" event of the year will be our Veteran's Day Lunch scheduled for Saturday, November 5th at the Shaker Heights Country Club involving not only the WRSSAR, but also the DAR and other Northeast Ohio patriotic, historical, and military groups.
